Each community researcher will be employed for **60 hours** and paid @ **£17.32 / hour** (research assistant rate) or **£18.75 / hour** (post-doctoral research assistant rate). The work can be completed between March and July 2021, with agreed milestones at the start of the contract.

The work will involve:

- One day's training provided by the Oral History Society, including on conducting online interviews;
- Recruitment, interviews and follow-up with 10 interviewees;
- Providing introductions / liaison where appropriate between networks, organizations and the project team.
